We are looking forward to welcoming Bonnie back to more rooms next week and she's loving how calm everyone is when they say hello to her of a morning in the office.









Visual Art - NAIDOC Week


In the first week of term we celebrated NAIDOC week and our elders in the Art room. First our grade 5/6 students discussed who our elders are and why they are important. We talked about who our own personal elders are, what makes them special to us and brainstormed words to describe them.

We then looked at the work of Taungurung woman and artist Maddi Moser. Her exhibition entitled "Land Currents" showcased mixed media artworks that consisted of a photo, a colour overlay from hand-painted high-flow acrylics or watercolour and digital illustrations.


Using photos of our school, the oak tree and the old Hugh's creek bridge students used the words we brainstormed and then created artwork over the images.











Grade 3/4 students also discussed the theme of 'For our Elders', who our own elders are and why they hold a special place in our heart. We brainstormed words that represented those special people. Following this we looked at cross-hatching within some artworks. Cross hatching is prominently seen in the northern parts of Australia around Arnhem Land.

Children then traced around their hand, writing down the words of importance regarding their elder/s and then experimenting with cross hatching and the effects that can be created.







Our junior classes listened to the dreamtime story of the Rainbow Serpent. We looked at how First Nations People used symbols within their artwork and how these artworks were used to pass on stories and knowledge from generation to generation.

Grade 1/2 students cut out a cardboard shape and then wound wool around their card to create their own serpent.





Prep students practised their pattern skills and then challenged themselves cut in a spiral to create a spinning snake.



An enormous thank you to all the families for getting on board and making this day a great success! A special mention to Carrye Malone for her support leading up to the event and on the day. From the Prep Team



































Community art project for peace.

You can help Goulburn Valley Libraries contribute to the International Day of Peace by making origami paper cranes. Help us reach the target of 1,000 paper cranes: come along to one of our paper crane-making events or make them at home and drop them off to your local library.

Paper cranes originate in the ancient Japanese tradition of origami or paper folding. Today they are known as a symbol of peace. The connection between paper cranes and peace can be traced back to a young girl named Sadako Sasaki, who died of leukemia ten years after the atomic bombing. Her story is best known through the book Sadako and the thousand paper cranes by Eleanor Corr. Sadako's death triggered a campaign to build a monument to pray for world peace and in memory of children that died because of the bombing. Later, this story spread to the world and now approximately 10 million cranes are sent each year to the Children's Peace Monument.

We will display all cranes made until Thursday 29th September before sending them to Japan where they will be placed at the Children's Peace Monument that stands in Peace Memorial Park in Hiroshima.

"We would like to see as many paper cranes as possible made and on display by the 21st of September, the international Day of Peace" says Bronwyn Cole, Program Co-ordinator for Goulburn Valley Libraries. "We want people from all our communities to contribute and then come in to see the display of what we hope will be thousands of paper cranes. Community members can make one paper crane or hundreds. Our libraries will be hosting origami crane making sessions throughout August and September so even if you have never made one before you will be able to contribute to the project".

Paper cranes can be dropped off at any Goulburn Valley Libraries branch, or to the Mobile Library from Tuesday 1st August until Thursday 21st September, the International Day of Peace. The paper cranes can be made out of any paper but squares should be no larger than 15cm by 15cm.
