Boîte Schools Chorus

The Boîte Schools Chorus is an un-auditioned choir project for schools and community youth choirs. Since 2004 the Boîte Schools Chorus has involved over 9,000 students from across Victoria in 42 concerts in Melbourne, Frankston, Ballarat, Bairnsdale & Albury. The Boite Schools Chorus project invites students into a new world through song, builds confidence, broadens horizons and develops valuable performance and interpersonal skills.

Each year the chorus focuses on a different cultural theme. The Boite Schools Chorus returned this year with Maiem: Songs from The Torres Straits. Working with Stella Savy and in collaboration with Meriam educator and musician Deb Lowah Clark and Meriam cultural advisor, musician and thespian Luke Captain, The Boite offered school communities across Victoria the exciting opportunity to learn about Zenadth Kes - the Torres Strait Islands.

Immersed in the songs and stories of the Torres Strait Islands, The Boite Schools Chorus 'Maiem' we listened, learned, experienced and performed songs that share the richness and diversity of the Torres Strait Islands peoples. Students discovered the purpose of songs, movements that connect to that purpose, and the importance of communicating storying and intentions during the production, rehearsals and performances.

The Torres Strait Islands are regularly mentioned when referencing Australia's First peoples. But few of us know anything about these glorious islands. Maiem: Songs from The Torres Straits gave us an insight into who the Torres Strait Islander people are and their unique culture and history.

After months of rehearsing at school and at home, on Thursday 3rd August, Ross and I had the pleasure of accompanying 12 of our amazing students on the train to Melbourne Town Hall. We were joined by many other schools to combine and create the Boîte Schools Chorus for this year.

The morning was spent rehearsing and after a short break it was concert time. With just under 300 students, voices filled the Melbourne Town Hall magnificently. It was an amazing experience, and I feel very fortunate to have taken part in such a wonderful event.



Community art project for peace.

You can help Goulburn Valley Libraries contribute to the International Day of Peace by making origami paper cranes. Help us reach the target of 1,000 paper cranes: come along to one of our paper crane-making events or make them at home and drop them off to your local library.

Paper cranes originate in the ancient Japanese tradition of origami or paper folding. Today they are known as a symbol of peace. The connection between paper cranes and peace can be traced back to a young girl named Sadako Sasaki, who died of leukemia ten years after the atomic bombing. Her story is best known through the book *Sadako and the thousand paper cranes* by Eleanor Corr. Sadako's death triggered a campaign to build a monument to pray for world peace and in memory of children that died because of the bombing. Later, this story spread to the world and now approximately 10 million cranes are sent each year to the Children's Peace Monument.

We will display all cranes made until Thursday 29th September before sending them to Japan where they will be placed at the Children's Peace Monument that stands in Peace Memorial Park in Hiroshima.

"We would like to see as many paper cranes as possible made and on display by the 21st of September, the International Day of Peace" says Bronwyn Cole, Program Co-ordinator for Goulburn Valley Libraries. "We want people from all our communities to contribute and then come in to see the display of what we hope will be thousands of paper cranes. Community members can make one paper crane or hundreds. Our libraries will be hosting origami crane making sessions throughout August and September so even if you have never made one before you will be able to contribute to the project".

Paper cranes can be dropped off at any Goulburn Valley Libraries branch, or to the Mobile Library from Tuesday 1st August until Thursday 21st September, the International Day of Peace. The paper cranes can be made out of any paper but squares should be no larger than 15cm by 15cm.
