TERM 3 PLC

What are PLC's? PLC's or Professional Learning Communities, are an approach to school improvement where teachers meet and work collaboratively regularly throughout the term to improve student outcomes. As a staff, we identify areas within our classroom practice that could be improved and work together to create a culture that is:

- focussed on continuous improvement by linking the learning needs of students with the professional learning and practice of teachers,
- Committed to professionalism,
- Fuelled by collaborative expertise.

This term, our PLC focus was writing. Teachers began by analysing the assessment rubrics that have been developed from the Victorian Curriculum and the 6 Traits of Writing (Organisation, Ideas, Sentence Fluency, Word Choice, Voice, Conventions). This allowed each year level team to identify the areas for improvement and set goals for their teaching approach to ensure that students were taught the next developmental skills.



PLC IMPROVEMENT CYCLE



Evaluate and diagnose – Teams used writing data from terms 2 and 3 to identify areas in need of improvement and why.

Prioritise and set goals – Teams discussed priority areas and how they could change their practice to improve student outcomes.

Develop and plan – Teams researched new practice and discussed how different these could be trialled in writing lessons. Teachers used this opportunity to modify their practice and used different resources to identify what practice was best for their students. All teachers were involved in lesson observations during this process. **Implement and monitor** – Teams came together to share what worked well, what could be applied from other teams to other year levels and how teams can continue to build on this new practice in writing as well as other subject areas.

The goals set by each team were: Prep Team:

• **Organisation** of a retell – students retelling in sequence using connective language to link ideas.

Grade 1/2 Team:

• Development of **Ideas** – elaborating an idea in a non-fiction text, including ideas that are relevant to the topic.

• Word Choice – using new and topic specific vocabulary.

Grade 3/4 Team:

• **Sentence Fluency** – constructing sentences beginning with different parts of speech.

Grade 5/6 Team:

• Individual goal setting using all **6 traits** and applying these goals to a free verse poem.

This style of practice and collaboration enables teachers to continue professional growth in order to promote student growth.
