Coaching at Avenel Primary School

At Avenel Primary School we are committed to a growth mind-set and the desire to continually grow as teachers through challenging our own practice. As part of our growth and development as learners we are implementing a cycle of coaching this term whereby each teacher works with our learning specialist to set personal practice goals.

The purpose of instructional coaching in schools:

- + Coaching is a professional learning strategy focused on improving performance to therefore have a positive impact on student learning.
- + Coaching aims to maximise coachee potential.
- + Coaching supports people to take responsibility for their own growth, set goals and take action to improve practice. It develops coachee self-awareness.

Placing goal setting in the hands of the teacher gives them the personal motivation to commit to change. Teachers are asked to answer these questions to guide the goal setting process:

- + When you think about the kind of teacher you want to be, what do you need to do to get there?
- + What is currently happening in your teaching practice that you would like to either further develop or not continue?
- + What might this change look like?
- + Tell me about the possibilities for action that you can see?


Teachers use the GROW model to set goals and a plan for implementation. They then have the chance to implement new practice and engage in the reflection process, identifying whether they have achieved their goals.

Examples of teacher goals include:

- Developing assessment practises to identify student need and track progress.
- Further building a bank of independent reading goals to target students next point of need in reading, while enhancing engagement in independent reading.
- Explicit teaching of reading comprehension strategies to deepen student understanding of text.
- Developing a scope and sequence for mental maths strategies when teaching multiplication and division.
- Increasing student engagement and motivation through open ended tasks.



Energy Breakthrough 2023

About Energy Breakthrough:

Since 1991, the Energy Breakthrough has provided opportunities for students, teachers, parents and local industry to work together to design and construct a vehicle, a machine or innovation in technology that will represent an 'energy breakthrough'.

The 2023 Energy Breakthrough event will be held from Wednesday 22nd to Sunday 26th of November in Maryborough, Victoria.



The program is unique in that all teams must compete across three areas of assessment:

- 1. Design and Construction,
- 2. Display and Presentation and
- 3. Trials.

The Program aims to ...

- Provide an excellent technology project for students from Prep to VCE level
- Encourage young people to explore solutions to environmental and transport issues
- Provide an opportunity for schools and communities to work and learn together
- Provide an opportunity for women and girls to participate in what has traditionally been a 'male' dominated area of the curriculum
- Be a fun program with real world challenges
- Offer students opportunities to explore and address vehicle design, driving skills and vehicle and passenger safety issues

The Three Program Elements ...

Display & Presentation

A 20 minute presentation to judges for team members to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of their entry.

Design & Construction

An informal conversation assessing the student's understanding of the vehicle and the concepts involved in its design and construction.

Trials

Thousands of students ranging in age from nine to 19 push, pedal and pilot carts, human powered vehicles and energy efficient vehicles in dynamic tests that can last just a few minutes or as long as 24 hours.

EB @ APS:

Avenel have been competing at Energy Breakthrough since 2015 and are the only school in the Strathbogie Shire that take part. Our students undergo rigorous training, beginning in term 1 on the recumbent bikes, steadily increasing in duration and intensity. They were visited by Brent Davies who has taught the strength exercises which they must complete daily.

Our students train in the bikes each Thursday afternoon after school, building their riding expertise as well as working as a team to get in and out of the bike, time laps and encourage best performance. They are now in the beginning stages of putting their display and presentation together.

The program at Avenel relies heavily on sponsorship from the community as the program has many costs such as entry, food and drink over the 3 days as well as bike maintenance. We are very lucky to have a number of sponsors on board this year offering money and supplies.

Each of whom shall be elected at Annual General Meetings.



(You can find the link to the application form by entering 'Nagambie' into the search bar on the linked page or scroll down the webpage to the second last grant opportunity on the list).

The key information regarding applications is:

- make sure your project proposal demonstrates community need and is broadly benefiting the community, not only your organisation
- break down your budget into as much detail as possible
- grants for purely sporting activities cannot be funded due to tax rules around sport not being a charitable activity but if your sporting club is proposing a project that benefits the community more broadly, particularly by meeting the needs of disadvantaged communities, it may still be able to be funded.

The grants program can fund projects from under \$10k in value to potentially larger projects or feasibility studies in the order of \$100-150k. The key is demonstrating community need and benefit.
