# Education SCHOOL REVIEW

Schools undertake a school review every 4 years to inform the directions of the school's 4 year School Strategic Plan (SSP) (a legislative requirement for all schools). Over the past 4 years, Avenel PS has had a strong focus from its SSP around Improving Literacy and Numeracy results of all students and improving student wellbeing. The first component of the review is the pre-review self-evaluation (PRSE) where schools review their data and other evidence to form a collective view of current practice and areas for improvement. The school has spent time getting the evidence from all teachers and the PRSE document is completed by Ross after gaining all of this valuable information.

This is followed by a review conducted by a panel, utilising the expertise of challenge partners and convened by an independent school reviewer. Our school reviewer, Sharyne, will spend 3 days at Avenel Primary School getting to know our school and talking to all stakeholders. As part of this process there will be an opportunity for parents to have their say on the school's performance. Look out in the newsletter over the next few weeks for the date and time of this parent forum. The panel will also consist of the school's leadership team, challenge partners, who are 2 principals from nearby schools, our school council president Sam and our Senior Education Improvement Leader from the Department of Education.

Concurrent with this panel process, the school reviewer undertakes an assessment of the school's compliance with the Minimum Standards for Curriculum and Student Learning as well as an audit of the school's policies and procedures around a number of key areas which our staff and School Council have worked on to ensure our school is compliant.

At the end of the process the school will receive a report on its progress and will set the direction of the school for the next four years.

## PROTECTING AGAINST MOSQUITO-BORNE DISEASES

Victoria's mosquito season started this month and will extend to late April 2024.

Warm and wet weather can result in greater numbers of mosquitoes and increased risk of illnesses from mosquito bites. While the overall risk is low, some mosquitoes carry diseases that make people sick. The best protection against mosquito-borne illness is to avoid mosquito bites.

Families can protect against mosquito bites by:

- covering up as much as possible with long, loose-fitting, lightcoloured clothing
- applying insect repellent that contains picaridin or DEET on exposed skin when leaving home
- · limiting outdoor activity if lots of mosquitoes are active.

To reduce the risk of illness linked to mosquitos, such as <u>Buruli ulcer</u>, promptly wash any new scratches or cuts with soap and clean water and apply a topical antiseptic and dressing. Japanese encephalitis virus is spread to humans through bites from infected mosquitoes and can cause a rare but potentially serious infection of the brain.


Free Japanese encephalitis vaccines are available to protect Victorians at higher risk of the virus. The Victorian Department of Health encourages eligible people who live or work in high-risk local government areas to get vaccinated ahead of summer, which brings an increased mosquito presence. The key information regarding applications is:

- make sure your project proposal demonstrates community need and is broadly benefiting the community, not only your organisation
- break down your budget into as much detail as possible
- grants for purely sporting activities cannot be funded due to tax rules around sport not being a charitable activity but if your sporting club is proposing a project that benefits the community more broadly, particularly by meeting the needs of disadvantaged communities, it may still be able to be funded.

The grants program can fund projects from under \$10k in value to potentially larger projects or feasibility studies in the order of \$100-150k. The key is demonstrating community need and benefit.



# **Free Movie Screening**




