Education

Science Term 4

The foundation students are learning about the basic needs of animals and plants, and comparing these to their own needs to survive. They discussed the difference between needs and wants, focusing on those items we can not do without. Their study was then directed towards plants and understanding what happens when their needs are not met or altered.

Year 1/2 students are studying various Australian animals. They discovered the unique features, habitats, and diets of a variety of Australian animals. Students were encouraged to sort animals by their covering and explored the different types of habitats that exist and where particular animals can be found in Australia. They explored diet and survival needs and how this relates to their habitat.

The year 3/4 students explored the concepts of living, once living and products of living things. Throughout the term the students participated in various activities which investigated the different products being studied. They learnt about the process these products take from the farmers paddock to our homes. They had the opportunity to do finger knitting with wool, bake bread with flour, sew with cotton thread, cook rice and recycle used paper.

In year 5/6 students studied animal and plant adaptations. They conducted various experiment to help them understand why plants and animals have particular features or behaviours helping them survive in their environment (blubber, camouflage, beak size and shape, frill on a lizard etc). They were given the opportunity to ask specific questions about their topic to guide their learning.



Students can bring their containers to school so that they can be recycled, along with other containers collected from lunch and snack time, with the funds going into the school's bank account towards Junior School Council fund raising.







Eligible Vs Ineligible Containers

Which containers are eligible for a refund?

Drink containers ranging from 150ml to 3 litres are eligible for a 10-cent refund if they're made from:

Glass

- Steel
- PET clear/coloured
- Liquid paperboard (small juice boxes or flavoured milk containers).
- Aluminium
- HDPE

To check if a container qualifies for a refund, look for the '10c' mark on it.

Eligible Containers



Ineligible Containers



Containers must be in good shape.

Containers cannot be crushed, or damaged, and the label or barcode should still be intact.

Which containers are ineligible for a refund?

These include:

- Plain milk containers
- Cordial, syrup, concentrated fruit, or vegetable juice bottles
- Glass containers that contained wine or pure spirits
- Large containers (1 litre or more) that contained flavoured milk, pure juice, cask wine or cask water
- Registered health tonics
- Highly contaminated aluminium such as pet food, tuna tins, or alfoil trays.

Why are some beverage containers eligible for a refund and some aren't?

Eligible containers are often found as litter in streets, beaches, waterways, and parks and are typically used when people are on the move, outside, or away from home. Containers not accepted are commonly used at home, making them better suited for regular household recycling.

Can lids be left on?

Leave lids on and they will be made into new products as well.

Can I refuse to take containers?

Yes, you can refuse to take any ineligible or contaminated containers and only accept suitable eligible containers.

What do I do with ineligible containers?

Ineligible containers may still be recycled. Advise customers to take these containers home and recycle them in their kerbside bins.


