### Catering for our diverse range of Learners!!!

At Avenel Primary School we embrace individuality and understand that we all like to learn in different ways.

We encourage our students to develop awareness of themselves as learners and identify the way in which they learn best.

Some of our students thrive on collaborative learning opportunities, while others prefer to work independently.

Some students need to learn by doing – using materials to develop conceptual knowledge and build their own understanding through investigation. Others learn best from oral instruction or visual supports.

Supportive classroom environments also allow us to cater for those who need to incorporate activity in their learning, using mini movement breaks to refocus attention.





Different curriculum delivery and design allows for one-on-one teacher instruction, small group work and whole group teaching opportunities.

A few of our students were able to share their insights into what is the best way for them to learn...

- "I know I work best when I can be in a space that allows me to focus and work independently."
- "I work best when I can talk to a partner or a group to help me come up with ideas."
- "I like the flexibility to work in different ways depending on how I feel or the subject area we are working on."
- "I am definitely a visual learner; I like to have visuals to explain concepts."
- "I need to have tasks explained to me, I find it much harder when we have to read instructions."

Ensuring students and teachers have an understanding of the way in which learning can be accessed by a range of learners enables us to provide the best learning opportunities for all of the students in our school.


### **Science**

In Sciene this term Prep students have been learning about the life cycle of a butterfly.

Did you know that the life cycle of a butterfly has 4 stages:

- egg,
- · caterpillar,
- pupa
- and adult butterfly.





After hatching, a caterpillar eats a lot and grows quickly, shedding their skin as they get bigger. They can increase in size more than 3,000 times!

A female butterfly can lay between 120 and several hundred eggs.

Some butterfly eggs hatch in a few days; others in a few months. The average is 8 days.

Only 1 in every 100 eggs survives and hatches; the rest are eaten or killed by disease.

Butterflies can see in green, yellow and red using the 6,000 lenses in their eyes.
