

Student Voice @ Avenel Primary School

Student voice acknowledges that students have unique perspectives on learning, teaching, and schooling, and should have the opportunity to actively shape their own education.

Student voice involves students actively participating in their schools, communities, and the education system, contributing to decision making processes and collectively influencing outcomes by putting forward their views, concerns and ideas.



Determining ways in which we can ensure our students have a say in their school and their learning has been a key priority area for us for many years. At Avenel Primary school we have a number of processes and systems that ensure student voice is encouraged, heard and followed through on. Some of the ways we encourage student voice include:

One-on-One interviews.

One-on-one interviews are carried out by Mr D with the Year 6s at least once a year. These interviews allow students to communicate their successes as well as any areas of concern that they may have. It is part of our Annual Implementation Plan this year to carry out one-on-one interviews with all students in the school.

Class Meetings

This term we have rolled out class meetings across the school. Each class has a timetabled meeting once a week, discussing an area for improvement around the school. Thanks to this process we have developed lunchtime clubs based around student requests and improved classroom and playground resources. In the senior classes students chair the meetings as teachers take a back seat and allow each student to have their say.









Junior School Council


Our JSC are the voices for all our classes to feed to our Principal. JASC council members have weekly meeting to discuss what is happening in their classrooms and around the school and be the voice of their peers. Out JSC run multi-age days to develop peer relationships, fundraise for the school and charities and make connections with our wider school community.



Student Surveys

Student surveys are generally completed at the end of each term, these surveys allow students to anonymously voice their feelings in relation to their learning, their connectedness to school and their voice at school. These surveys are unpacked by leadership and the wellbeing team to determine areas for improvement, identify professional learning opportunities and set goals for the future.

Student Reports

From the Art Room...

2022 saw our first incredible Art show here at Avenel Primary School. After such success we decided that we celebrate all of the children's amazing artworks in this format every second year, with this being the year for our **second show**! I am not sure how we will top the first one, however we will try out best! This will be held towards the end of term three. As a result, you will not see any of your children's work arrive scrunched up in the bottom of their school bag over the course of this year, as I will be storing it all in preparation for our Art Show.

Our Prep students have explored drawing, painting and construction this term. We have experimented with different drawing tools to create different types of lines. These were used to create the bristles of a paintbrush we constructed and also a crazy background. We have constructed our own sculptures from paper strips, followed directions to draw Pigeon, from the story 'Don't let the pigeon drive the bus,' by Mo Willems and also used shapes as stencils to flick paint around the outside of.

Grade 1/2 students have been working on their drawing skills for most of this term. We began by revising the colours of the rainbow, creating gorgeous vibrant crayons and then looked at the story 'The Colour Monster' by Anna Llenas, followed directions to learn how to draw a monster, then created images to match our colour monster, cutting this out and creatin a collaged collection. Lastly we squeezed in some painting to model some hearts off the work of Jim Dine.





Term 1 has seen the grade 3/4 students complete a directed drawing of some stunning Toucans, (currently on display in the office). We have then used the rest of the term to create our own radial printing plate design, paint a radial background in colours, then pull black prints from our printing plates, over the colourful background. This was a big project, but worth all the effort.



Our 4/5 class began the year with a construction and lettering activity, where they created their own fence made from pop sticks, then practised writing their name in a graffiti style and transferring this to their fence. These are currently on display on the shelves under the TV in them main building. We then looked at the work of Victorian artist Grotti Lotti. Grotti has a very busy art style, which we had a go at painting parrots. These are probably my favourite creations this term! We have finished the term creating a loom on a paper plate for us to weave on. These are going to be turned into Woven Jellyfish next term.



Lastly, our grade 6 students also began by focussing on lettering, also creating a little fence with their name graffitied on it. I then challenged their cutting skills by creating a collage of their silhouette, exploring the Art Principal of Movement in their work. Printing has also been a focus, creating a birch forest and they have created a background reminiscent of a checkered tablecloth in preparation for some doughnuts next term!

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
