
Maggie Aldridge - For her engagement and dedication on Sovereign Hill camp, dressing up as a child from the 1850s. 9

### **Lunchtime Clubs @ Avenel Primary**

At Avenel Primary School we understand that playtimes can be trick for some of our students. Sometimes they don't feel like being outside, other times they might be unsure what or who to play with and sometimes they just fancy a change. To support our students, we run a different lunchtime club each day to enable students to have options and choice over what they choose to participate in the longer break session.

When engaging in these lunch time clubs students build connections with other students in the group and the teacher running the group, they build communication skills, problem solving skills as well as develop help seeking strategies. Lunchtime clubs can have benefits for students and the whole school community, including:

- improved peer-to-peer and teacher-student relationships and wellbeing
- a sense of personal empowerment and student voice
- development of social and emotional skills
- improved academic achievement
- positive school climate and increased student sense of safety
- reduction in bullying and playground behaviour incidents

Last week, the grade 5's and 6's embarked on their journey of time travel. We left Avenel Monday morning and by early afternoon we arrived in 1850's Ballarat. The students had plenty of time to wander around Sovereign Hill, undertake some shopping before we hit the Pantomime.

The next morning, students were up early to get ready for their day at Sovereign Hill's costume school. Nerves were high and students knew their schooling perspectives were about to change. Throughout the day, they were exposed to all aspects of 1850's life and the expectations that wavered, depending on your age and whether you were a boy or a girl.

Students were also exposed to all aspects of the schooling curriculum, learning their 16- and 17-times tables and how to write in copperplate. Excitement was high and students loved the immersive experience, chatter floating throughout the cabins at the end of each day.





Enrolling in Foundation (Prep) | Victorian Government







Apply now to enrol your child in Foundation (Prep) for 2025.

If you have a child starting primary school in 2025, it's time to enrol. Make sure to submit your enrolment application by *Friday 26 July 2024*. If you are enrolling the sibling of a student at our school for Foundation in 2025, and both children will be attending our school at the same time, your child is prioritised for a place at our school as per the department's Placement Policy.

It is important to follow the statewide timeline to enrol your child in Foundation. Enrolling your child in line with the timeline allows us to plan our classrooms, staffing and transition activities and ensures your child has the best start to school.

Steps to enrol your child in Foundation (Prep) for the 2025 school year

- To start primary school in 2025, your child will need to turn 5 years old by 30 April 2025. Schooling is compulsory for children who have turned 6 years old.
- If your child is starting Foundation (Prep) in 2025, you will be able to apply to enrol your child in a Victorian government primary school from the start of Term 2, 2024 (Monday 15 April 2024).

What you need to do:

- Use <u>Find my School</u> to locate your designated neighbourhood school (referred to
- as your local school) and other nearby government schools.
- Contact a government primary school to book a school tour or to learn more about the school and the enrolment application process.
- Obtain a copy of the Foundation (Prep) Enrolment Information Pack for Parents and Carers from the
  office or our website.
- Submit an enrolment application for Foundation (Prep) by Friday 26 July 2024.

- You will be notified of the outcome of your application between Monday 29 July and Friday 9 August 2024. If you receive an enrolment offer, you should accept the offer by Friday 23 August 2024.
- Take part in information and transition sessions during Term 4, 2024.
- Your child will start Foundation (Prep) from Wednesday 29 January 2025.
- Enrolment applications submitted after 26 July 2024 will be processed by the school as they are received, in accordance with the Department of Education's Placement Policy.
- Your child has a right to enrol at their local school. Your child's local school is determined on the basis of their permanent residential address. Visit Find my School to locate your child's local school.

### **EVENT PROCEDURES**

Participants will play on a short course with holes set up no longer than:

Par 3s - 150 meters Par 4s - 340 meters Par 5s - 430 meters

Shorter tees will be setup for non - handicap players by age group

(primary & secondary)

Maximum strokes per hole players without a handicap

Once a player has ten strokes on any hole, the ball must be lifted with 10 placed against the relevant hole on the scorecard. Any deliberate attempt to hit the ball must be considered a stroke. No further strokes are permitted on a hole. Bunkers

After two shots in a bunker the player may pick up their ball and play it from the side of the bunker no closer to the hole. Should a player play directly from one bunker into another bunker then their next shot shall be deemed their second bunker shot. No extra penalty shot for placing the ball outside the bunker.

If a ball is lost during play, a player must drop another ball at the point of entry to where the ball was lost under penalty of one shot

### Adult Presence

Each group must be accompanied by an adult whose responsibilities include safety, etiquette and scoring when necessary
