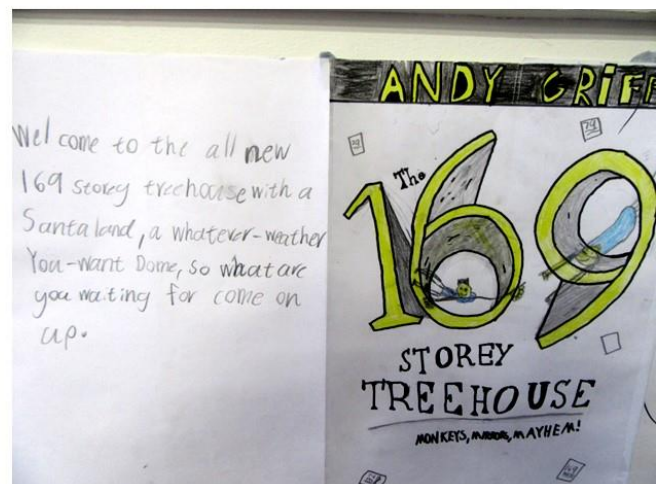
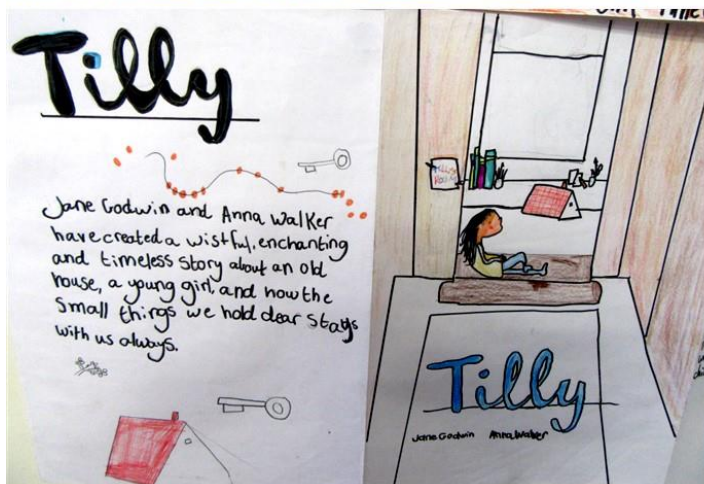


BOOK NOW

Inclusive Education at Avenel Primary School – The Process for Additional Supports

Key parts of Disability Inclusion

A new tiered funding model

A new funding model is being rolled out with more investment to help us support inclusive practices. The model will allow us to make the adjustments our students need to help with their participation, engagement and learning at school. It provides additional investment that our school can use to support groups of students like those with autism, ADHD and other learning difficulties.

A new Disability Inclusion Profile

The profile will help our school and families identify the strengths, needs and educational adjustments we can make to help students with disability.

The profile will be completed with the support of key people who understand the student's education and support needs. An independent facilitator will help us work through the profile with families.


Investment in building skills and knowledge in inclusive education

A range of new activities and supports will build the knowledge and skills of our school's workforce. This means our school staff will have more access to specialist expertise, coaching, professional learning and support.

Our school must make reasonable adjustments to ensure students with disability can access and participate in education on the same basis as students without disability.

Disability Inclusion Funding Model

The funding model has three tiers of funding and support, based on the level of need and the adjustments required to support a student's learning and participation at school.

The Disability Inclusion Profile

A Disability Inclusion Profile is a written description of a student's strengths and needs that will help us plan what will work best for a student.

It will inform personalised funding allocations and will replace the current Program for Students with Disabilities (PSD).

The profile will also be available to a broader group of students with disability.

Profiles are completed at a Student Support Group meeting with the student and people who know them.

Our school will:

- begin to complete profiles, with an initial focus on students entering prep
- ask you to provide consent for your child to have a profile created
- work with you to find a suitable time to complete a profile for your child if it is needed
- gather information for the profile meeting, including any relevant supporting information such as NDIS plans or other assessments
- use the student's profile to help inform personalised funding allocations and adjustments for the student or groups of students
- include agreed adjustments into the student's Individual Education Plan
- identify students who are not currently part of the PSD who may benefit from a profile.

Student Support Group profile meeting

If needed, you will be invited to take part in a special Student Support Group meeting to create your child's Disability Inclusion Profile.

An independent facilitator will run the meeting and help to complete the profile. The meeting will run for about 90 minutes.

At the meeting

The group will:

- talk about the student's strengths, goals and functional needs (what the student needs to help them participate and learn at school)
- talk about the adjustments the student needs to allow them to participate on an equal basis as their peers
- talk about the level of adjustment that is required for each school-related activity
- share ideas, understand one another's point of view and share responsibility.

After the meeting

- parents and carers and the school will receive a profile report in the weeks following the meeting. They can discuss it at a Student Support Group meeting
- the Student Support Group will decide when the student needs a new profile (this may be when the child is preparing to transition from different school settings or when their needs change)
- the Student Support Group will regularly check on how the student is responding to adjustments and whether they are being implemented as intended.

Our school

We have three years to complete a Disability Inclusion Profile for students who are currently receiving Program for students with Disability (PSD) funding. If your child is part of the PSD, we will work with you to find the most suitable time to complete your child's profile.

If you have concerns about the adjustments being made for your child, you should discuss this with school leadership.

Changes at our school

- We are using school-level funding to make adjustments that suit student needs.
- Teaching and school staff are developing skills and knowledge will be better prepared to respond to our student's needs. Our school's inclusive culture will further develop so that all students are supported and can succeed in life and in school.

We know that inclusive schools have better outcomes in learning, engagement and wellbeing for all students.

Features

Strength-based focus

A student's functional needs and adjustments are identified through a strength-based discussion.

Greater access

The profile will be available to a broader group of students with disability.

Facilitated and supported

Disability Inclusion facilitators will be trained in the profile and will support schools and families to work together through the new approach.

Shared understanding

The profile will help participants identify and discuss the student's needs and required adjustments, as well as building capacity in schools. It will inform personalised funding allocations for students with high needs.

WHOOPING COUGH - Whooping cough cases are continuing to increase across Victoria, particularly among school-aged children. Whooping cough is a very contagious infection, mostly spread through coughing or sneezing.

Symptoms include:

- blocked or runny nose
- tiredness
- mild fever
- severe bouts of coughing, often followed by a 'whooping' sound on breathing.

Whooping cough can lead to life threatening infections in babies.

If your child is unwell, they should not attend school. Please see a doctor if you or your child develops whooping cough symptoms. Early diagnosis and treatment will help reduce the spread of the infection.

Students diagnosed with whooping cough must not attend school. If your child is diagnosed with whooping cough, they must not attend school for 21 days after the onset of the cough, or until they have received 5 days of antibiotic treatment. You must notify the school if your child is diagnosed with whooping cough. To further reduce the spread of infection to your child and the school community, the Public Health and Wellbeing Regulations 2019 require that some students who were in the same classroom as a student diagnosed with whooping cough should not attend school.

Your child should not attend school for 14 days after they were last exposed to a person diagnosed with whooping cough, or until they have taken 5 days of a course of antibiotic treatment if they are:

- aged less than 7 years; and
- not fully vaccinated with 3 doses of whooping cough (pertussis) vaccine.

This exclusion is required by law – refer to the School exclusion table for primary schools and children's services. If your child is diagnosed with whooping cough, please contact the school to let us know. We hope we can work together to protect the whole school community by following the recommended advice.

For more information about whooping cough, refer to Whooping cough on the Better Health Channel.

Vaccination is the best way to reduce the risk of whooping cough. The Department of Health recommends staying up to date with immunisations, including booster doses. A free booster dose of the pertussis vaccine is covered under the national immunisation program for students aged 12 to 13. If you are unsure about your child's vaccination status for whooping cough, please discuss with an immunisation provider, such as your doctor. We really appreciate your support in keeping our students safe and well.

SUBJECT CONTRIBUTION – School Council have set the Subject Contribution for this year at \$245 per student. This amount is usually paid in Term 1 but other arrangements can be made if you are still recovering from Christmas and holidays! The subject contribution payment covers the cost of subject expenses and class materials which have been purchased by the school and will be distributed to students throughout the year. This contribution can be paid either by cash or EFPOS at the school or by direct deposit to the school account BSB 063 545 Account No 10076513. Please insert 'sub cont' and family name in the reference field.



If you haven't already done so, you still have time to take part in the **Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Survey** as it doesn't close until the 20th September. Your views are important to us and help direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All families were invited to participate in the survey which was e-mailed out in July. If you didn't receive your e-mail please contact the office and we will resend it.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones.

SCHOOL STUDENT BROADBAND - What is it?

The School Student Broadband Initiative offers free internet to eligible families until the end of 2025.

Here's what you need to know:

- **Free internet:** If your family qualifies, you'll get free NBN internet at home. You'll get to choose from a list of internet providers.
- **Application deadline:** You have until December 31 2024 to apply.
- **Start date:** The free service starts when your internet is connected and lasts until December 31 2025.
- **Family use:** Everyone in your household can use the internet.
- **After the free period:** When the free service ends, you won't be automatically charged. You'll need to agree before paying for any continued service.
- **If you move house:** You can take the free service with you if your new home is eligible. Just contact your internet provider to arrange this.

How to check if you can get it

Check online by going to anglicarevic.org.au/student-internet (External link).

- Leave your contact info.
- They'll call you back when it's convenient for you.

You can also call 1800 954 610.

- Tell them your home address. They'll check if you already have NBN there.
- You don't need to share any financial information.
- If you need help in another language, just ask. They can help.

A reminder that the Seymour College Kelly Club are running a Holiday Program and bookings are now available.



General Information: We believe in giving children opportunities to do the things they love and enjoy in a supportive and encouraging environment. We provide quality childcare in safe and fun surroundings for children out of school. Our holiday program is focused around sports, games, and outings to local attractions. Our friendly staff are passionate about working with children. They are provided with training on behaviour management techniques, first aid, child protection and activity planning/delivery.

Who can attend: Children aged 5-13 yrs

What do you need to bring: Shoes and appropriate clothing, jacket or sweatshirt, hat, drink bottle and food.

Food: Please bring plenty of packed food and drink for morning tea/lunch/afternoon tea. Lunch will be from approximately 12:30pm to 1:00pm each day.

Program activities: Program activities are adapted to suit children of all ages and children may be grouped by age depending on numbers. Program activities may vary without notice dependent on weather conditions and program numbers.

Payment details: Payment is required 7 days from receiving an invoice. An invoice will be issued once attendance has been completed and will be adjusted based on CCS subsidies.

CCS (Child Care Subsidies): Kelly Club is CCS approved with Services Australia, which means you can enjoy a subsidy of up to 90% of your fees, depending on your circumstances. This is then paid directly to Kelly Club on your behalf. For more information visit www.my.gov.au

Cancellations: Kelly Club requires 24 hours written notice for a booking cancellation. Fees will be charged if notice is not received. Kelly Club will require 5 days written notice for booking an excursion/incursion days and 3 days written notice for a booking cancellation for excursion/incursion days. Event Day Fees: Excursion fees – up to \$40 per child. Incursion fees – up to \$30 per child.

Please notes: Every care will be taken to ensure the safety of your child/ren and their property. However, organisers of Kelly Club accept no liability for any injury sustained to your child/ren or any loss or damage to his/her property whilst on the program. If your child/ren are collected late after the conclusion of the program you will be charged \$1 per minute.

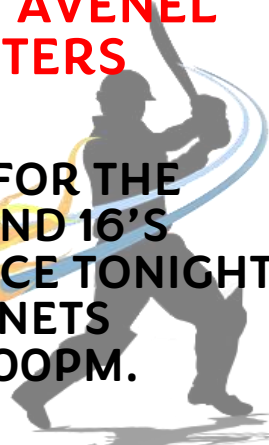
