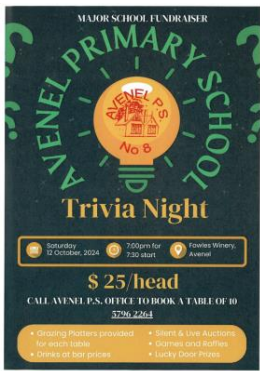

Education

What's in Store for Term 4????

During our final week at school for Term 3, staff have been developing their curriculum plans for next term. Here are some topics and highlights our students can look forward to kicking off term 4.

Science

Chemical science – exploring materials and their properties and investigating solids, liquids and gases.

Digital Technologies

Our senior students will learn coding skills and explore programs like Scratch and Tynker.

English

Junior classes are developing skills in writing informative texts – procedural texts, recounts, factual descriptions and information reports.

While our senior classes are honing their skills in writing narratives with plot twists.

Our Grade 6s will also explore persuasive writing through analysing and creating news reports.

Mathematics

Grade 1/2/3/4/5 will be exploring multiplication and division strategies to begin the term, as our Preps begin to create and identify patterns in different forms.

History

Junior classes will be learning about our history – significant events and changes to society over time.

Civics and Citizenship

Our 3/4/5 classes will conduct investigations into understanding local government.



Ditto visits P-2

Bravehearts' Ditto's Keep Safe Adventure Show teaches young children essential personal safety skills using age-appropriate language, song, and dance.

The Show stars Bravehearts' lovable lion cub 'Ditto' and a specially trained presenter and is a fun, interactive show.

The Bravehearts Ditto's Keep Safe Adventure Show is underpinned by the below principles of personal safety. Teaching young children these principles can help to increase resilience and reduce the risk of child sexual abuse, as well as other forms of abuse including family violence and bullying.

- Differentiating safe and unsafe feelings
- Recognising the body's warning signs
- Body ownership and that it is ok to say no
- Helping children name public and private parts using anatomically correct names
- Reinforcing that there is no secret that children cannot tell someone
- What to do if you feel unsafe or unsure

These personal safety principles are distilled into three easy-to-remember 'rules' that are reinforced throughout the Show. **'Ditto's 3 Rules'** are:

- We all have the right to feel safe with people.
- It's ok to say NO if you feel unsafe or unsure.
- Nothing is so yucky that you can't tell someone about it.

PIE WARMER – A reminder that the Pie Warmer will not be available for student use to heat lunches next term.

LOST PROPERTY – Our lost property basket is overflowing with unnamed items. **Please** make the effort to come in and check that there are not any of your child’s items in there. Any unclaimed items will be washed and put in our 2nd hand uniform store at the end of term.

WHOOPING COUGH - Whooping cough cases are continuing to increase across Victoria, particularly among school-aged children. Whooping cough is a very contagious infection, mostly spread through coughing or sneezing.

Symptoms include:

- blocked or runny nose
- tiredness
- mild fever
- severe bouts of coughing, often followed by a ‘whooping’ sound on breathing.

Whooping cough can lead to life threatening infections in babies.

If your child is unwell, they should not attend school. Please see a doctor if you or your child develops whooping cough symptoms. Early diagnosis and treatment will help reduce the spread of the infection.

Students diagnosed with whooping cough must not attend school. If your child is diagnosed with whooping cough, they must not attend school for 21 days after the onset of the cough, or until they have received 5 days of antibiotic treatment. You must notify the school if your child is diagnosed with whooping cough. To further reduce the spread of infection to your child and the school community, the Public Health and Wellbeing Regulations 2019 require that some students who were in the same classroom as a student diagnosed with whooping cough should not attend school.

Your child should not attend school for 14 days after they were last exposed to a person diagnosed with whooping cough, or until they have taken 5 days of a course of antibiotic treatment if they are:

- aged less than 7 years; and
- not fully vaccinated with 3 doses of whooping cough (pertussis) vaccine.

This exclusion is required by law – refer to the School exclusion table for primary schools and children’s services. If your child is diagnosed with whooping cough, please contact the school to let us know. We hope we can work together to protect the whole school community by following the recommended advice.

For more information about whooping cough, refer to Whooping cough on the Better Health Channel.

Vaccination is the best way to reduce the risk of whooping cough. The Department of Health recommends staying up to date with immunisations, including booster doses. A free booster dose of the pertussis vaccine is covered under the national immunisation program for students aged 12 to 13. If you are unsure about your child’s vaccination

status for whooping cough, please discuss with an immunisation provider, such as your doctor. We really appreciate your support in keeping our students safe and well.

SUBJECT CONTRIBUTION – School Council have set the Subject Contribution for this year at \$245 per student. This amount is usually paid in Term 1 but other arrangements can be made if you are still recovering from Christmas and holidays! The subject contribution payment covers the cost of subject expenses and class materials which have been purchased by the school and will be distributed to students throughout the year. This contribution can be paid either by cash or EFPOS at the school or by direct deposit to the school account BSB 063 545 Account No 10076513. Please insert 'sub cont' and family name in the reference field.



If you haven't already done so, you still have time to take part in the **Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Survey** as it doesn't close until the **20th September**. Your views are important to us and help direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All families were invited to participate in the survey which was e-mailed out in July. If you didn't receive your e-mail please contact the office and we will resend it.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones.

Kelly Club News

A reminder that the Seymour College Kelly Club are running a Holiday Program and bookings are now available.



General Information: We believe in giving children opportunities to do the things they love and enjoy in a supportive and encouraging environment. We provide quality childcare in safe and fun surroundings for children out of school. Our holiday program is focused around sports, games, and outings to local attractions. Our friendly staff are passionate about working with children. They are provided with training on behaviour management techniques, first aid, child protection and activity planning/delivery.

Who can attend: Children aged 5-13 yrs

What do you need to bring: Shoes and appropriate clothing, jacket or sweatshirt, hat, drink bottle and food.

Food: Please bring plenty of packed food and drink for morning tea/lunch/afternoon tea. Lunch will be from approximately 12:30pm to 1:00pm each day.

Program activities: Program activities are adapted to suit children of all ages and children may be grouped by age depending on numbers. Program activities may vary without notice dependent on weather conditions and program numbers.

Payment details: Payment is required 7 days from receiving an invoice. An invoice will be issued once attendance has been completed and will be adjusted based on CCS subsidies.

CCS (Child Care Subsidies): Kelly Club is CCS approved with Services Australia, which means you can enjoy a subsidy of up to 90% of your fees, depending on your circumstances. This is then paid directly to Kelly Club on your behalf. For more information visit www.my.gov.au

Cancellations: Kelly Club requires 24 hours written notice for a booking cancellation. Fees will be charged if notice is not received. Kelly Club will require 5 days written notice for booking an excursion/incursion days and 3 days written notice for a booking cancellation for excursion/incursion days. Event Day Fees: Excursion fees – up to \$40 per child. Incursion fees – up to \$30 per child.

Please notes: Every care will be taken to ensure the safety of your child/ren and their property. However, organisers of Kelly Club accept no liability for any injury sustained to your child/ren or any loss or damage to his/her property whilst on the program. If your child/ren are collected late after the conclusion of the program you will be charged \$1 per minute.
