General Information



CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUNDING (CSEF) – FOR NEW FAMILIES ONLY

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$150 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office and ask for an application form. You can find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page. Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE – Students who live 4.8 kilometres or more (closest point of property boundary in relation to the stop) from school or their bus stop, may be eligible for a conveyance allowance. Applications forms are available from the office and must be lodged with the School by Friday 21st February.

LUNCH ORDERS TERM 1 2025

For the first 3 weeks of 2025, lunch orders will only be available on Friday. Please note you can call the shop on 5796 2536, pop in or drop an envelope into the school with the order and money. We ask that you do this after 8:30am only until Shaun returns week commencing 17 February. Orders must be placed by 10am, this includes payment. Orders will receive a coloured dot. This means the child will need to see one of the Avenel Cafe Staff to get either a drink, donut or icypole.

FOUNDATION (PREPS) – A reminder that Foundation (Prep) students **ARE NOT** required at school on a Wednesday until the 12th March.

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION – School Council have set the Voluntary Contribution for this year at \$225 per student This amount is usually paid in Term 1 but other arrangements can be made if you are still recovering from Christmas and holidays! The voluntary contribution payment covers the cost of subject expenses and class materials which have been purchased by the school and will be distributed to students throughout the year. This contribution can be paid either by cash or EFPOS at the school or by direct deposit to the school account BSB 063 545 Account No 10076513. Please insert 'vol cont' and family name in the reference field.

SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS - Over the next few weeks we will be holding an election process to constitute our School Council membership for 2025. School Councils play a crucial part in the governance of Victorian state schools and being a part of School Council is a wonderful opportunity to make a lasting contribution to our school. We would strongly encourage all parents to consider nominating as candidates for election. If you would like to know more about the School Councillor role, please don't hesitate to get in touch.

CODE RED DAYS – SCHOOL PROCEDURES - Given the prevalence of bushfires across Victoria, it is timely to communicate our school's procedures for declared Code Red days. Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire risk and is listed on the Bushfire at Risk Register – this list is compiled using information provided by the CFA and contains close to 500 schools across Victoria. On a declared Code Red Day, our school will be closed. Where possible, we will provide parents with up to four days notice of a potential Code Red day closure by SMS. A Code Red day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1.00 pm the day before the potential closure. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Code Red day we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- No staff will be on site on days when the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located.
- Our bus run will be cancelled.

ABSENCES – NOTIFYING OUR OFFICE - We remind all parents to please make contact with our office or submit an absence note via Compass if your child is absent from school. Department of Education procedures require us to make "same day" contact with families who have a child absent from school. In the case of unexplained absences, it is a departmental requirement that we obtain a parental explanation for the absence; accordingly, if your child is absent and we have not been advised of the reason, we will send home an absence statement for you to record the reason for the absence.

ACCIDENT, AMBULANCE & PERSON INSURANCE COVERAGE – Parents are reminded the Department does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents or guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance or ambulance coverage, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transport as well as any other transport costs. Private property brought to school by students, staff or visitors is not insured and the Department does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage. This can include mobile phones, calculators, toys, sporting equipment and cars parked on school premises. As the Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property, students should be discouraged from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school.



Have Your Say! - Avenel Railyard Carpark



Avenel Active is launching a community survey about the Avenel Railyard carpark

Residents have called for many years for improved and safe off-street parking for Avenel Railway Station and town centre businesses, and a safe footpath between the station, Saleyard Road and Bank Street.

But the carpark remains a potholed surface of track ballast and other blue metal. There is no level access to parking for rail passengers and no other off-street parking or disabled parking in Avenel town centre.

There is no safe footpath from the station to Saleyard Road and Bank Street and no separation from 60km/hr traffic on Bank Street.

The railyard is mainly owned by the Victorian Government and managed by VicTrack, with a small area the responsibility of Council.

We believe Avenel deserves better. We are calling on the Victorian Government and Strathbogie Shire Council to work together to provide a better connected and safer town centre for Avenel.
