Swimming

Our School Swimming Sports was held last week and it was a hugely successful day. Our school sports are all about participation, enjoyment and giving events a go! The carnival day is planned with 50 metre, 25 metre, across the pool and novelty events allowing students of all swimming abilities to participate and enjoy.

Our 50 metre events are for our older, more serious swimmers, who are keen to participate in the interschool events, such as District Swimming. These events are offered in the four major strokes and the students can qualify for the individual events or as part of a relay team.

Students who are only just learning to swim or are not as confident in the water can participate in the shorter 25 metre events or in the "Across the Pool" events which allows everyone to join in at their level.

The events across the pool, run separately for senior and junior students, have more of a skill focus in their races, with the use of aides such as a kickboard or noodle. The students in these races still get to compete for ribbons and earn points for their House. To cap off the day, there is the novelty ball scramble which is one of the highlights and certainly creates a lot of excitement for everyone.

This year, after a great day of participation, the winning House was Hughes and they celebrated with the announcement at our weekly assembly.

General Information



CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUNDING (CSEF) – FOR NEW FAMILIES ONLY

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$150 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office and ask for an application form. You can find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page. Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE – Students who live 4.8 kilometres or more (closest point of property boundary in relation to the stop) from school or their bus stop, may be eligible for a conveyance allowance. Applications forms are available from the office and must be lodged with the School by Friday 21st February.

LUNCH ORDERS TERM 1 2025

For the first 3 weeks of 2025, lunch orders will only be available on Friday. Please note you can call the shop on 5796 2536, pop in or drop an envelope into the school with the order and money. We ask that you do this after 8:30am only until Shaun returns week commencing 17 February. Orders must be placed by 10am, this includes payment. Orders will receive a coloured dot. This means the child will need to see one of the Avenel Cafe Staff to get either a drink, donut or icypole.



Have Your Say! - Avenel Railyard Carpark



Avenel Active is launching a community survey about the Avenel Railyard carpark

Residents have called for many years for improved and safe off-street parking for Avenel Railway Station and town centre businesses, and a safe footpath between the station, Saleyard Road and Bank Street.

But the carpark remains a potholed surface of track ballast and other blue metal. There is no level access to parking for rail passengers and no other off-street parking or disabled parking in Avenel town centre.

There is no safe footpath from the station to Saleyard Road and Bank Street and no separation from 60km/hr traffic on Bank Street.

The railyard is mainly owned by the Victorian Government and managed by VicTrack, with a small area the responsibility of Council.

We believe Avenel deserves better. We are calling on the Victorian Government and Strathbogie Shire Council to work together to provide a better connected and safer town centre for Avenel.
