Our grade 3s and 5s are participating in NAPLAN this week and have made a great start approaching the tests with an "I Can Do It" positive attitude. The students will complete assessments in Reading, Writing, Maths and Conventions of Language throughout this week, as all year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students across Australia will do in the coming days. Parents will be notified of their child's results when they are provided to school later this year.

We have our school swimming program next week where every student from P- 6 receives three lessons at the Seymour Indoor Pool with qualified instructors. There is no cost to students, as it is funded by the Department of Education. This is the second year that we have run our program in this way and the feedback has been very positive, so we are looking forward to it again this year.

We are very excited for our grade 3/4 teacher, Elle Thomas, who will be commencing Family leave at the end of this term as she expects the arrival of her second baby. I am pleased to announce that we have filled this position with an experienced teacher, Mr David Jenner, who will commence as the 3/4 teacher full time at the start of term 2. 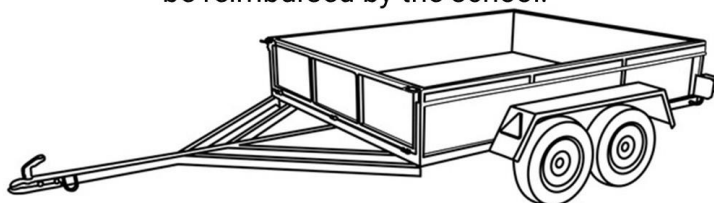

## **CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUNDING (CSEF) – FOR NEW FAMILIES ONLY**

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. Payment amounts this year are \$150 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child. **If you applied for CSEF through our school last year,**

**you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.**

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office and ask for an application form. You can find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page. Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

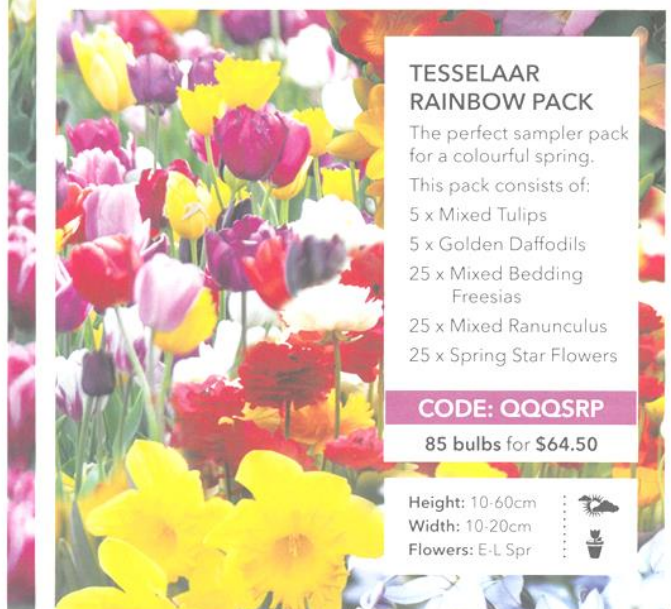
